After Move-in Checklist

The boxes are open. You have food in the fridge.

Now, tackle a few critical "to do's" once you've moved in.

1. COMPLETE A HOME INSPECTION

If you did not complete a home inspection prior to close, consider hiring a licensed home inspector to identify areas of concern. This helps you prioritize repairs and remodeling.



2. TEST THE HOME FOR RADON

Radon is the #1 cause of lung cancer in nonsmokers, resulting in over 21,000 deaths annually. The only way to know whether a home has hazardous levels of radon gas is to test. A DIY test can be purchased online or at any hardware store. Some home inspectors even test for radon. 3. LOCATE THE FUSE BOX, GAS SHUTOFF AND MAIN WATER SUPPLY SHUT OFF

In case of an emergency, it is important to know where the main utility controls are in your home. Label all main controls for easy access.

Request a change of address at the post office and the DMV. Don't forgot to change your address with financial, personal, wellness, and community organizations.
